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DRUG MEDICAL ORGANIZED DELIVERY SYSTEM (DMC-ODS)



The DMC-ODS will transform the current Substance Use Disorder system to one that has:

- New and Expanded Services with timely access to care
- Better Coordination and Continuity of Care
- Individual Assessments (ASAM) and Tailored Treatment to Support Long-Term Recovery



ASAM CRITERIA



1. Acute Intoxication and/or Withdrawal Potential

- *Exploring an individual's past and current experiences of substance use and withdrawal*

2. Biomedical Conditions and Complications

- *Exploring an individual's health history and current physical condition*

3. Emotional, Behavioral, or Cognitive Conditions and Complications

- *Exploring an individual's thoughts, emotions, and mental health issues*

4. Readiness to Change

- *Exploring an individual's readiness and interest in changing*

5. Relapse, Continued Use, or Continued Problem Potential

- *Exploring an individual's unique relationship with relapse or continued use or problems*

6. Recovery/Living Environment

- *Exploring an individual's recovery or living situation, and the surrounding people, places, and things*

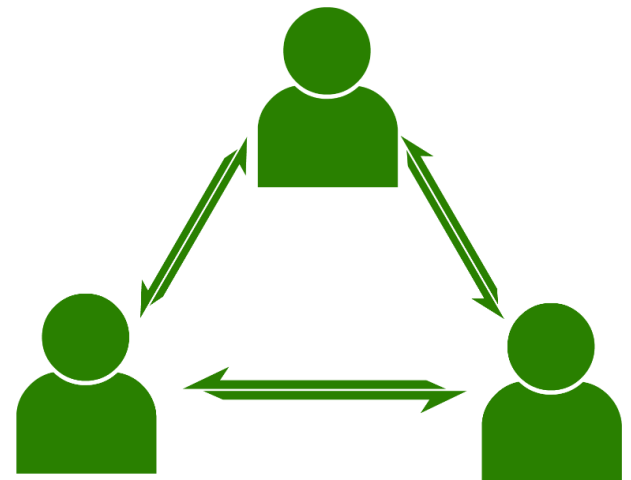


COLLABORATIVE COURTS



LIVE WELL
SAN DIEGO

- Behavioral Health Court
- Veteran's Treatment Court
- Drug Court
- Reentry Court
- Homeless Court





- Attorney referrals are assigned to Assessor
- Assessor determines level of care and amenability to treatment
- Assessor and client apply to specific program
- Client is granted probation, 'releasable' to treatment
- Assessors transport directly to program

PUBLIC DEFENDER DETENTIONS TRAINING UNIT (DTU)



- Centered around licensed mental health clinicians
- Referrals come directly from attorneys
- Referrals come ASAP
- All within the attorney-client privilege
- Targets “MH management” situations
- 5 working days for feedback and to discuss treatment plan.





- Let lawyers be lawyers
- Treatment plans establish a baseline for client
- Good program interface
- Gather statistics for BHS
 - **Make use of time in custody
 - **Client does not hit the street

EFFECT OF DMC-ODS IMPLEMENTATION

- High volume means little room for error
- Detours or Delays mean time in custody
- Improvement to placement process, or quality of care?
- Effort to avoid disruption of SAA placement success



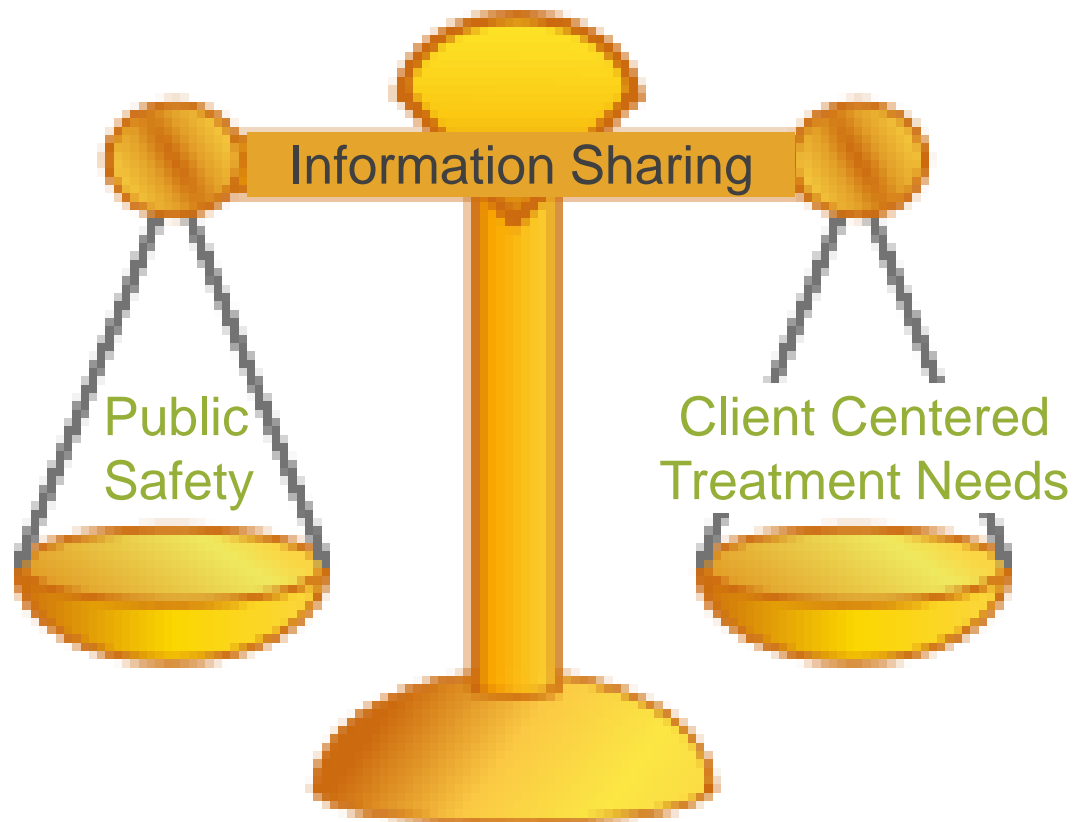


- More clinical assessment (compare probation and court)
- Avoid 'automatic' residential treatment
- Medical needs addressed
- Co-Occurring needs addressed
- Network of Recovery Residences

- Reassuring Sentencing Judges
- Balancing clinical care and supervision
- Incorporating criminogenic factors
- Housing, always

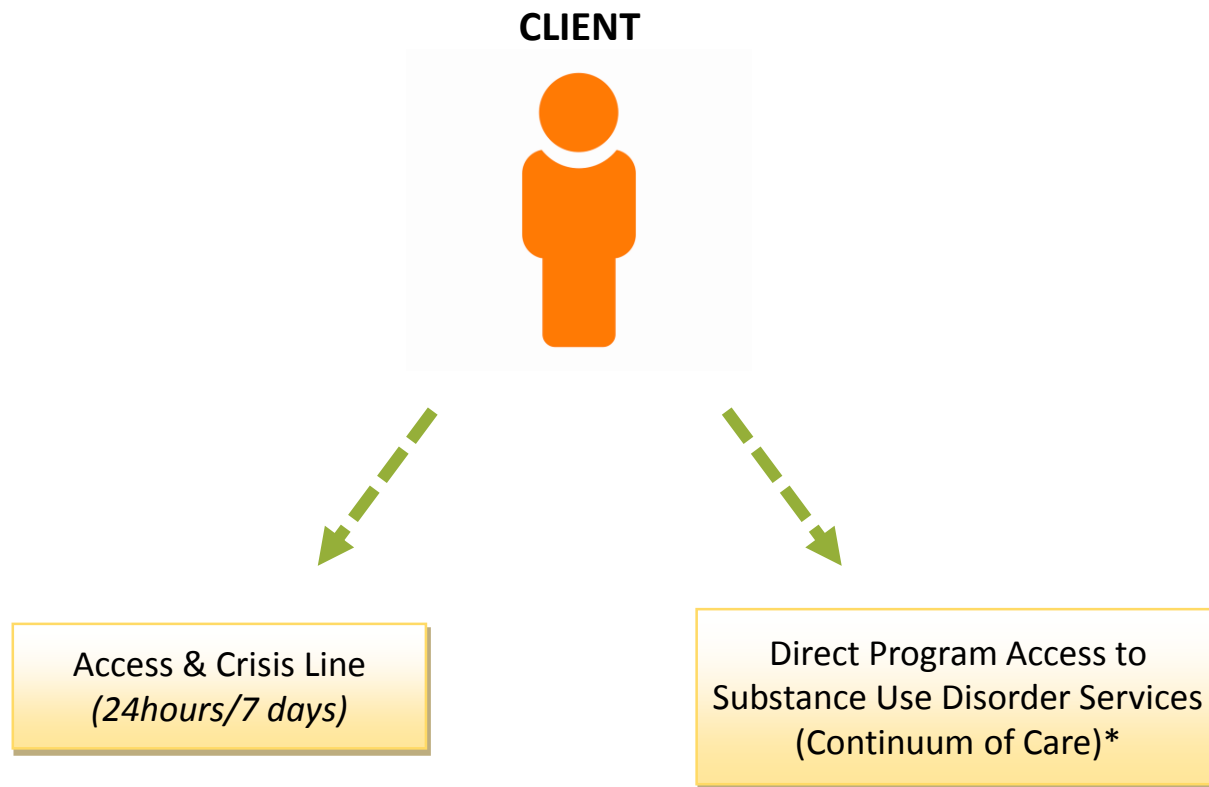
